



William Butterworth Foundation Scholarship Program

For many years, the William Butterworth Foundation has demonstrated a commitment to education by granting Butterworth/Deere-Wiman Scholarships to graduating high school seniors who reside in Moline School District 40 and plan to attend a college or university in the fall. As of 2017, the Foundation supports 11 students, from college freshman through senior levels, at schools located across the country.

Recipients can receive up to \$2,000 per year (\$1,000 per school term) for tuition and other education-related expenses). Each scholarship is renewable for a total of four years (\$8,000), if a 2.5 GPA is maintained and reporting requirements to the William Butterworth Foundation are met after each semester.

Scholarship selection is based not only on academic achievement and financial need, but also on a student's extracurricular activities and community service while in high school.

Requirements:

- Resides in Moline School District 40 (does not have to be a Moline High School senior, but does have to live within District 40)
- Will graduate in the year application is made
- Can provide proof of enrollment for the coming fall term at a university or college, or at a two-year community college in a curriculum that will transfer to a four-year institution
- Minimum overall high school GPA of 2.5
- Participated in community service and/or extracurricular activities in high school
